



American Sign Language Expert Content Developers

The University of Arizona National Center for Interpretation engages independent consultants with expertise in American Sign Language (ASL) interpretation to develop testing and training content. Content experts must be extremely proficient in ASL and knowledgeable of Deaf culture. Qualified experts will:

- Develop content for ASL proficiency test items
- Produce media for test items with language testing expert
- Review test items and provide expert feedback
- Work with team of experts in project delivery

Minimum Requirements for Content Expert Candidates:

- Recent experience working in the field of interpretation.
- B.A. or B.S. or equivalent in a related field
- Proof of advanced fluency in American Sign Language and English.
- State or Federal (national) Certification as interpreter (submit copy of certification records).
- Ability to arrange own travel to project site(s) and invoice for services and expenses.
- Have legal authorization to work in the United States.

Preferred Requirements:

- Prior content development experience
- M.A. or M.S. in translation and interpretation, linguistics, foreign language or related field or equivalent experience.
- Federal (national) Certification as interpreter (submit copy of certification records).
- Proof of liability insurance to work as consultant.

Evaluation:

Quality, timely project completion. Future project assignments depend upon enrollment needs and performance.

Compensation: DOE.

Proposal process:

Initial proposals can be reviewed by sending a cover letter and current CV to ncitrp@email.arizona.edu. Individuals successfully meeting qualifications and language and program needs will be asked to submit additional documentation in order to advance. Interviews and background checks will be conducted as needed. Successful finalists must be University of Arizona employee or meet eligibility requirements to work as an individual contractor in the U.S.
